More recently, college enrollment rates were higher in 2017 than in 2010 for Hispanic (36 vs 32 percent) young adults and lower in 2017 than in 2010 for White (41 vs 43 percent) and American Indian/Alaska Native (20 vs 41 percent) young adults There was no measurable difference between the 2010 and 2017 college enrollment rates for young adults
