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The AIA guidelines state that completing the ICRA should be the result of a "consultative" process. If a construction or renovation program is in your future, you may want to review the guidelines with your colleagues in facilities planning. An architect can assist you in determining how the AIA guidelines will affect your project.

The ICRA elements required for consideration are located in Chapter 1.5 of the 2006 AIA Guidelines. In the 2006 edition, the ICRA elements are divided into three areas: processes for design, construction, and mitigation. Design

Infection control risk assessment (ICRA)

Conduct an infection-control risk assessment (ICRA) and provide an adequate number of All and PE rooms (if required) or other areas to meet the needs of the patient population (1,2,7,8,17,19, 20,34,36--43). Category IA, IC (AIA: 7.2.C, 7.2.D)

Guidelines for Environmental Infection Control in Health ...

Use AIA guidelines as minimum standards where state or local regulations are not in place for design and construction of ventilation systems in new or renovated health-care facilities. Ensure that existing structures continue to meet the specifications in effect at the time of construction. (AIA: 1.1.A, 5.4) IC: C.I.B.

Adoption of the FGI Guidelines - FGI

The Guidelines for Design and Construction of Hospital and Healthcare Facilities, 2010, formerly known as "AIA Guidelines" was the origin of the "infection control risk assessment" now required by multiple agencies. These Guidelines represent minimum US health care standards and provide guidance on best practices.

Current views of health care design and construction ...

The AIA guidelines do not describe or mandate how it is to be carried out, but merely require documentation that it was done to protect and prevent infectious risks to patients. Enforcement agencies also do not prescribe the process.

Hospital Construction: Stirring Up Trouble

The new AIA Guidelines strongly support infection control input at the initial stages of planning and design by requiring a new element termed an Infection Control Risk Assessment (ICRA) for broad and long-range involvement of infection control/epidemiology leadership.¹⁹

APIC State-of-the-Art Report: The role of infection ...

The AIA's 2006 Guideline for Design and Construction of Health Care Facilities 2 mandates an "infection control risk assessment" or ICRA before beginning any new construction or major renovation project. Federal enforcement (CMS) or accrediting agencies (Joint Commission) require an ICRA if the health care organization receives Medicare/Medicaid funding.

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
