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Cosmetic Uses Of Botulinum Toxin

Injectable botulinum toxin (BT) has a variety of medical and cosmetic uses. BT causes temporarily paralysis of muscles and therefore is effective for dynamic wrinkles, i.e., the wrinkles that develop during facial expression and movement. Long-standing static rhytids, which are present when the face is at rest, will be minimally affected.

Cosmetic Use of Botulinum Toxin

Cosmetically, the injectable can be used in the following areas: the area between the eyebrows (glabellar region), to treat moderate to severe frown lines around the eyes, commonly known as crow's feet lines

Botulinum toxin is an effective treatment for glabellar frown lines, crow's feet, vertical lip lines, and forehead lines by blocking innervation to the muscles contracting perpendicularly to the axis of the wrinkles. It is also possible to modify facial appearance by selectively weakening certain aspects of agonist and antagonist muscle groups.

In 2002 was the first dermatological and Cosmetic FDA approval of Botulinum toxin (BOTOX®) for moderate to severe glabellar lines. And in 2004 it was approved for axillary hyperhidrosis. 2.

Botulinum toxin is used in the treatment of overactive bladder, urinary incontinence, chronic migraines, spasticity (contractions causing muscle stiffness), cervical dystonia (neck muscles contracting involuntarily), severe underarm sweating, eyelid spasms, crossed eyes, and drooling. It is also used for the treatment of facial lines and wrinkles.

What is botulinum toxin used to treat?

Botulinum toxin (Botox) is a neurotoxic protein produced by the bacterium *Clostridium botulinum* and related species. It prevents the release of the neurotransmitter acetylcholine from axon endings at the neuromuscular junction, thus causing flaccid paralysis. Infection with the bacterium causes the disease botulism. The toxin is also used commercially for medical and cosmetic purposes.
