Addressing Faculty and Staff. Always use a formal address, such as Professor, Dr., Ms., or Mr. It's important to address the person you're emailing by name. If you don't remember your professor's name, check your syllabus or look on SOAR.

"Informal emails" is meant for emails to your friends, colleagues and (since we're pretty informal at university) University staff. "Formal emails" is for when you write formal emails while applying for jobs, interviews, internships or funding etc. It also pays to err towards formality when emailing anybody you don't know outside of the School.

### A Short Guide to Email Etiquette at University

Here we will focus on the standard and formal styles of email. Standard style. 1. Email address. Use a professional email address, which includes your first name and last name so that the recipient knows who you are. Please note that you are expected to use your UTS email account when communicating with your lecturers and other UTS staff members.

Send emails from your Unimelb email address This shows that you're enrolled at the University of Melbourne. If you use a personal email address, it may be filtered as spam, meaning your lecturer will not be able to see your email. Try to figure out the problem by yourself first

Always use it if emailing a group of students or customers, so that you don't share email addresses without a lawful basis for doing so. With larger groups. it's much better to use YAMM instead of BCC (plus you benefit from seeing useful statistics about your email).

Let the Sender Know Their Message Has Been Received. Email messages can get lost in the mail or in the spam filter. As a courtesy, especially with important messages (such as those with attachments or having to do with deadlines), write a short note to let the sender know their email was received.

### **How to Mind Your Manners With Email Etiquette**

Just like a written letter, be sure to open your email with a greeting like Dear Dr. Jones, or Ms. Smith: Use standard spelling, punctuation, and capitalization. THERE'S NOTHING WORSE THAN AN EMAIL SCREAMING A MESSAGE IN ALL CAPS. Do not use text abbreviations (like u instead of you, for example).
